WHEREAS charters of cities of the third class in this commonwealth require the improvement of streets, alleys and other public ways and side walks to be made at the exclusive cost of owners of real estate abutting on said improvements:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the board of commissioners of the city of Henderson, Ky., that said Main street from the south side of Washington street to the north side of Jackson street, and between the curb and gutter lines on the east and west sides thereof, and from each of the aforesaid curb and gutter lines out toward the center of the street a distance of not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-four feet, be improved by excavating, grading and draining the same and by constructing and paving the same with either brick, concrete, treated wooden blocks, sheet asphalt, bitulithic asphalt, Warrenite, rock asphalt, asphaltic concrete or other bitulithic paving or other bitulithic concrete paving, or other bituminous paving, or other bituminous concrete paving, upon a base of concrete, stone or other suitable material as shall hereafter be determined by the board of commissioners of the city of Henderson, Ky., except the intervening street intersections between the south line of Washington street to the north side of Jackson street shall be improved by paving as aforesaid the full width of Main street between its gutter lines; and by the construction of suitable concrete or stone curbs and gutters where the same do not now exist, and such suitable catch basins, inlets and manholes as may be necessary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the intervening space along the center of said street and between the improvements of the two carriage ways, be improved, be excavating and grading where required and by placing on the same a suitable coating of gravel, rock or screenings or other suitable street material as may hereafter be determined by the board of commissioners or by the removal of street material between said carriage ways, except that portion of the street occupied by the tracks of the Henderson Traction Company and for 12 inches on each side of the rails, and placing

The Mayor declares the commissioners convened in adjourned session.

On motion of commissioner Cunningham, seconded by commissioner Haag, the following resolution was adopted which is here copied as follows.

WHEREAS THE CONDITION OF Green street, in the city of Henderson, Ky., from the south side of Twelfth street to the north side of Third street, has become greatly out of repair and in a worn and dilapidated condition, and the same needs to be constructed with material more permanent in its character than that of which it is now composed; and

WHEREAS charters of cities of the third class in this commonwealth require the improvement of streets, alleys and other public ways and sidewalks to be made at the exclusive cost of owners of real estate abutting on said improvements;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the board of commissioners of the city of Henderson, Ky., that said Green street from the south side of Twelfth street to the north side of Tenth street and between the curb and gutter lines on the east and west sides thereof, be improved by the construction of a pavement of not less than 16 nor more than 30 feet in width, in the manner and of the materials hereinafter provided; and that said Green street from the south side of Tenth street to the north line of Third street, be improved by the construction of a pavement between the curb and gutter lines on the east and west sides thereof and from each of the aforesaid curb and gutter lines out toward the center of the street a distance of not less than 16 nor more than 24 feet; said improvements to be made of the material and constructed in the manner hereinafter described; and said improvements be made by excavating, grading and draining said street and by constructing and paving the same with either brick, concrete, treated wooden blocks, sheet asphalt, "Warrenite", rock asphalt, asphaltic concrete or other bitulithic paving, or other bitulithic concrete paving, or other bituminous paving, or other bituminous concrete paving, upon a base of concrete, stone or other suitable material as shall hereafter be determined by the Board of commissioners of the city of Henderson, Ky., except that the intervening street intersections on said street from Tenth street to Third street, inclusive, shall be improved by paving as aforesaid the full width of Green street between its gutter lines; and by the construction of suitable concrete or stone curbs and gutters where the same do not now exist, and such suitable catchbasins, inlets and man-holes as may be necessary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the intervening space along the center of said street from the south line of Tenth street to the north line of Third street be improved by excavating and grading where required and by placing on the same a suitable coating of gravel, rock or screenings or other suitable street material, or by the removal of material between said carriage-way and the placing therein to the proper depth of a fill of earth suitable for sod or shrubbery, as may hereafter be determined by the said board of commissioners.

Resolution for improvement of Green street, from south side of First street to the city limits.

On motion of commissioner Haag, seconded by Mayor Hall, the following resolution was adopted which is here copied as follows:

WHEREAS the condition of Green street, in the city of Henderson, Ky., from the south side of First street to the city limits, has become greatly out of repair and in a worn and dilapidated condition, and the same needs to be constructed with material more permanent in its character than that of which it is now composed, and

WHEREAS charters of cities of the third class in this commonwealth require the improvements of streets, alleys and other public ways and sidewalks to be made at the exclusive cost of owners of real estate abutting on said improvements:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of commissioners of the city of Henderson, Kentucky, that said Green street, from the south side of First street to the south side of Center street and between the curb and gutter lines on the east and west sides thereof, be improved by the construction of a pavement between said curb and gutter lines, in the manner and of the materials hereinafter described; and that said street from the south line of Center street to the north line of Clay street and between the curb and gutter lines on the east and west sides thereof, be improved by the construction of a pavement out towards the center of the street a distance of not less than 16 nor more than 28 feet in width, of the materials and in the manner hereinafter described; and that said street from the south line of Clay street to the city limits and between the curb and gutter lines on the east and west sides thereof, be improved by the construction of a pavement of not less than 16 nor more than 30 feet in width, of the materials and in the manner hereinafter provided; that said improvements be made by excavating, grading and draining said street and by constructing and paving the same with either brick, concrete, treated wooden blocks, sheet asphalt, bitulithic asphalt, "Warrenite", rock asphalt, asphaltic concrete, or other bitulithic paving, or other bitulithic concrete paving, or other bituminous paving, or other bituminous concrete paving, upon a base of concrete, stone or other suitable material as shall hereafter be determined by the board of commissioners of the city of Henderson, Ky., except that the intervening street intersections on said street between the south side of First street and the south side of Clay street, inclusive, shall be improved by paving as aforesaid the full width of Green street between its gutter lines, and by the construction of suitable concrete or stone curbs and gutters where the same do not now exist, and such suitable catch basins, inlets and man-holes as may be necessary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the intervening space along the center of said street, from the south line of Center street to the north line of Clay street, be improved by excavating and grading where required and by placing on the same a suitable coating of gravel, rock or screening, or other suitable street material, or by the removal of material between said carriage-way which is unoccupied by the tracks of the Henderson Traction Co., and for 12 inches on each side of the rails, and the placing therein to the proper depth of a fill of earth suitable for sod or shrubbery, as may hereafter be determined by the said Board of commissioners.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a curb of concrete, wood or stone, or other suitable material, not exceeding 8 inches in width, shall be built along the outside of said carriage-ways next to the intervening strip and at each street intersection.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said improvements be and the same are hereby declared to be a necessity, and that the same be made at the expense of the property holders abutting such improvements, but not including the cost of improvement of intersections with other public ways, or other streets or public alleys which run into but do not cross said Green street, which shall be done at the expense of the city of Henderson, and except the cost of improvements between the rails of the 1 line of railroad track of the Henderson Traction Company on said street, and for a distance of 12 inches from said rails and on the outside thereof which shall be paid for by the Henderson Traction Company.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that said Henderson Traction Company shall have the right to construct its own part of such improvements in the event that it shall, before the letting of the contract for the aforesaid improvements, elect by written request, presented to the Board of commissioners, to construct its part of said improvement, and shall execute bond to the said city, with good and sufficient surety, to be approved by the Mayor of said city, conditioned that it will do the work of improving such part of said Second street and with the material aforesaid, and according to such plans and specifications and within such time and subject to such provisions as the ordinance providing for the aforesaid improvement may prescribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that after the publication of this resolution as by law required an ordinance be prepared, providing for such improvements and be presented to the Board of commissioners of said city for its action thereon.

An Ordinance fixing the rates to be charged consumers in the city of Henderson Ky.
2nd reading.

An ordinance fixing the rates to be charged consumers of Gas in the city of Henderson, Ky.; providing for the collection of same; and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, was read the second time and a motion of commissioner Cunningham, seconded by comr Haag, same is approved and adopted on its second and final reading.

Aye: Hall, Haag, Cunningham. Three aye:

The Mayor declared said ordinance adopted on its second and final passage.

The said Ordinance is here copied as follows to wit:

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED: An Ordinance fixing the rates to be charged consumers of Gas in the city of Henderson, Ky.; providing for the collection of same; and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of commissioners of the city of Henderson, Ky.:

SECTION ONE: That hereafter the price of gas to consumers in the city of Henderson, Kentucky, shall be as follows, to wit: Two dollars (\$2.00) per thousand feet, subject to a discount of forty cents (40) per thousand feet, provided said bills are paid as follows, viz:

- (a) Bills against consumers of gas in the first ward of the city of Henderson, Ky.; on or before the 15th day of the calendar month next succeeding the calendar month in which the gas is used;
- (b) Bills against consumers of gas in the second ward of the city of Henderson, Ky.; on or before the 25th day of the calendar month next succeeding the calendar month in which the gas is used;
- (c) Bills against consumers of gas in the Third ward of the city of Henderson, Ky.; on or before the 11th day of the calendar month next succeeding the calendar month in which the gas is used;
- (d) Bills against consumers of gas in the fourth ward of the city of Henderson, Ky.; on or before the 7th day of the calendar month next succeeding the calendar month in which the gas is used.

SECTION TWO. Bills for gas shall be made out for the gross amount with the discount specified therein, as stated in section one of this ordinance, and shall be payable to the Auditor of the city of Henderson, Ky., on or before the dates specified in section one hereof. If so paid said discount shall be deducted therefrom; provided, the minimum gross bill for gas shall not be less than seventy-five cents (.75) per month with a twenty-five (25) discount on said minimum bills if paid on or before the dates specified in section one hereof.

SECTION THREE. Should said bills for gas be not paid, on the following dates, to wit:

- (a) Bills against consumers of gas in the first ward on or before the 20th day of the month;
- (b) Bills against consumers of gas in the second ward on or before the 28th day of the month;
- (c) Bills against consumers of gas in the Third ward on or before the 16th day of the month;
- (d) Bills against consumers of gas in the Fourth ward on or before the 13th day of the month;

next succeeding the month in which such gas is used, then in that event, it shall be the duty of the superintendent of the gas works to have the service of the delinquent disconnected, any service so disconnected shall not be reconnected until all delinquent bills are paid, together with the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) for services in disconnecting and reconnecting.

WHEREAS the condition of Clark street, in the city of Henderson, Kentucky, from the north line of the Second street pavement to the north curb line of East Fourth street and between the curb and gutter lines on the East and West sides thereof has become greatly out of repair and in a worn and dilapidated condition and the same needs to be constructed of a material more permanent in its character than that of which it is now composed; and

WHEREAS charters of cities of the third class in this Commonwealth require the improvement of streets, alleys and other public ways and sidewalks to be made at the exclusive cost of owners of real estate abutting on said improvements:

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of the city of Henderson, Kentucky, that said Clark street from the north pavement line of Second street to the north curb line of East Fourth street and between the curb and gutter lines on the East and West sides thereof, be improved by excavating, grading and draining the same, and by constructing and paving the same with either brick, concrete, treated wooden blocks, sheet asphalt, bitulithic asphalt, "Warrenite", rock asphalt, asphaltic concrete or other bitulithic paving or other bitulithic concrete paving, or other bituminous paving or other bituminous concrete paving, with suitable weed or concrete curbs or headers where necessary, upon a base of concrete, stone or other suitable material as shall hereafter be determined by the Board of commissioners of the city of Henderson, Kentucky; and by the construction of suitable concrete or stone curbs and gutters where suitable gutters do not now exist, and such suitable catch basins, inlets, and man-holes as may be necessary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said improvements be and the same are here by declared to be a necessity, and that the same be made at the expense of the property holders abutting such improvements, but not including the cost of improvement of intersections with other public ways and not including one-half the width of Clark street opposite other street or public ways which run into but do not cross said Clark street, which shall be done at the expense of the city of Henderson; and except the cost of the improvement between the rails of the line of rail-road track of the Henderson Traction Company on said street and for a distance of 12 inches from said rails, and on the outside thereof, which shall be borne and paid by said Henderson Traction Company; and except the cost of improvement between the rails of the line of railway of the Louisville, Henderson & St. Louis Railway Company, on said street and for a distance of 12 inches from said rails and on the outside thereof, which shall be borne and paid by the said Louisville Henderson & St. Louis Ry. Co.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, the said Henderson Traction Company shall have the right to construct its own part of such improvement in the event that it shall, before the letting of the contract for the aforesaid improvements, elect by written request presented to the Board of commissioners, to construct its part of said improvement and shall execute bond to the said city, with good and sufficient surety, to be approved by the Mayor of said city, conditioned that it will do the work of improving such part of said Clark street and with the material aforesaid, and according to such plans and specifications and within such time and subject to such provisions as the ordinance providing for the aforesaid improvement may prescribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that after the publication of this resolution as by law required, an ordinance be prepared providing for such improvements and be presented to the Board of Commissioners of said city for its action thereon.

WHEREAS the condition of East Fourth street in the city of Henderson, Kentucky, from the west curb line of Clark street for a distance of approximately four hundred feet northwest and between the curb and gutter lines on the north and south sides thereof, has become greatly out of repair and in a worn and dilapidated condition and the same needs to be constructed of a material more permanent in its character than that of which it is now composed; and

WHEREAS charters of cities of the third class in this Commonwealth require the improvements of streets, alleys and other public ways and side walks to be made at the exclusive cost of owners of real estate abutting on said improvements:

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of commissioners of the city of Henderson, Kentucky, that said East Fourth street from the west curb line of Clark street a distance of approximately four hundred feet northwest, from the northeast gutter line out in a southeasterly direction a distance not less than thirty feet nor more than forty five feet be improved by excavating, grading and draining the same and by constructing and paving the same with either brick, concrete, treated wooden blocks, sheet asphalt, bitulithic asphalt, "Warrenite", rock asphalt, asphaltic concrete or other bitulithic paving, or other bitulithic concrete paving, or other bituminous paving or other bituminous concrete paving, with suitable wood or concrete curbs or headers, where necessary, upon a base of concrete, stone or other suitable material as shall hereafter be determined by the Board of Commissioners of the city of Henderson, Kentucky; and by the construction of suitable concrete or stone curbs and gutters where suitable gutters do not now exist, as may hereafter be provided for and such suitable catch basins, inlets and man-holes as may be necessary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said improvements be and the same are hereby declared to be a necessity, and that the same be made at the expense of the property holders abutting such improvements, but not including the cost of improvement of intersections with other public ways and not including one-half the width of East Fourth street opposite other streets or public ways which run into but do not cross said East Fourth street, which shall be done at the expense of the city of Henderson.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that after the publication of this resolution as by law required, an ordinance be prepared providing for such improvements and be presented to the Board of commissioners of said city for its action thereon.
