At an adjourned meeting of the Board of Commissioners, held in the city building in the city of Henderson, Ky., Thursday afternoon March, 20th, 1924 at 2 o'clock P.M.;

Presiding the Honorable Clay F. Hall Mayor;--

The following commissioners were present and answered to their names at roll call to wit;--Commissioner J.H. Hart, Commissioner J.W. Johnson, all present;--

The Mayor declared the commissioners convened in adjourned session

On the motion of commissioner Hart, seconded by commissioner Johnson, that a Resolution directing the preparation for the issue of, Washington street concrete sidewalks and curb improvements bonds be adopted which is copied as follows:--

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE PREPARATION AND ISSUE OF WASHINGTON STREET SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENT BONDS.

WHEREAS at an adjourned meeting of the Board of Commissioners for the City of Henderson, Kentucky, held in said City on June 29th, 1923, an ordinance was duly passed providing for the improvement of the east and west sides of Washington Street, from the east line of Green Street to the west line of Halloway Street, in said City, by building thereon concrete sidewalks, five feet wide, and concrete curbing and guttering, according to the specifications set out in said ordinance, which was duly and properly passed on its first reading on said date, and which said ordinance was also duly and properly passed on its second reading at a regular meeting of said Board of Commissioners held in said City on July 9, 1923, and immediately thereafter published as required by law; and
