The Mayor declared the Commissioners convened in adjourned session.

On motion of Commissioner Hart, seconded by Mayor Hall, the following resolution is read and adopted; for the first time. Viz;-

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the City of Henderson, Kentucky, purchase gas pipe, of the 6 inch size in diameter and to the amount not to exceed \$3500.00 in value--Commissioner J.W. Johnson, who has charge of the Gas Works is directed to order said pipes, after first receiving bids for said pipes

Resolution
Awarding Contract for pauper patient care to the Moseley Hospital
2nd Reading

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Henderson, at several meetings of said Board of Commissioners, have heretofore considered the best manner and means of caring for its pauper patients, was, by entering into a contract with the Moseley Hospital, or with J.C. Moseley, president of Moseley Hospital, acting for and on behalf of said hospital.

AND WHEREAS the said City of Henderson, Kentucky, by its Board of Commissioners, has heretofore entered into said contract with the said Moseley Hospital by directing the signing and execution thereof by the Mayor of the City of Henderson,

AND WHEREAS it is possible that the proceedings of the Board of Commissioners may not be fully regular and proper as prescribed by law, NOW, for the purpose of correcting any error that may have heretofore existed in the execution of the contract herein referred to:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners that the following contract be entered into by and between the City of Henderson and the said Moseley Hospital upon the terms and conditions therein set out, which said contract is in words and figures as follows, to-wit;

"THIS CONTRACT made and entered into this the _____ day of _____, 1924, by and between the Moseley Hospital, a Kentucky corporation, with its principal place of business at Henderson, Kentucky, party of the first part, and the City of Henderson, party of the second part.

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) per annum, to be paid by the City of Henderson to the said Moseley Hospital in monthly installments of Four Hundred and Sixteen Dollars and Sixty-Six and Two-thirds cents (\$416.66-2/3) each, the said Moseley Hospital hereby agrees to receive at its private hospital at the northeast corner of Washington and Adams Streets in the City of Henderson, Kentucky, such pauper patients as the City of Henderson may from time to time send to said hospital for hospital care and to furnish the room, board, lodging, and all necessary care, including nursing and surgical dressings for said pauper patients.

It is further agreed that the Moseley Hospital is to furnish one of its staff of surgeons, namely, either Dr. J.C. Moseley or Dr. M.Y. Marshall, to do any and all surgery that said pauper patients may be in need of, when requested by the City of Henderson through its City Physician, and to do so without cost to the City of Henderson for said surgical attention.

It is further stipulated and agreed and made a part hereof that the City of Henderson is to send no patients to said hospital with any infectious or contagious disease that might endanger the health or lives of other patients, nor shall said Moseley Hospital be required to receive any such patients.

It is further stipulated and agreed that no patient may be sent to the Moseley Hospital without an order signed by the Mayor of the City, or the Commissioner of Public Health, provided, however, that in case of emergency, pauper patients may be received upon the written order of the Chief of Police or any policeman or any commissioner.

It is expressly stipulated and agreed between the parties hereto that the said City of Henderson, by giving thirty days written notice of its intention so to do, shall have the option of renewing this contract at the time of its expiration for a period of two years longer, upon the same terms and conditions as stipulated herein.

This contract shall take effect and be in force ten days after

The Mayor declared the ordinance approved and adopted on its second and final reading; which said ordinance is as follows:-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HENDERSON, KENTUCKY, PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE EAST SIDE OF ALVASIA STREET BETWEEN CLAY AND DIXON STREETS, BY CONSTRUCTING A CONCRETE SIDEWALK, TOGETHER WITH CURB AND GUTTER, THEREON, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Henderson, Kentucky, that the east side of Alvasia Street, Between Clay and Dixon street, in the City of Henderson, Kentucky be improved by the construction of a concrete sidewalk, together with curb and gutter, thereon, in the following manner, to-wit;

Section 1. That the east side of Alvasia Street from the curb line of the sidewalk on Clay Street where Alvasia and Clay streets intersect, thence up Alvasia Street to the property line at Dixon Street and contiguous with said property line and extending parallel with said property line with said property line for a distance of five (5) feet, is designated and established as a sidewalk, and contiguous to said five (5) foot pavement on the part towards Alvasia street for a distance of twenty-four (24) inches, designated and established for curbs and gutters, and said sidewalk, curb and gutter shall be constructed according to the following grade, to-wit:

Section 2 Beginning at the curb line of the sidewalk on Clay street at an elevation of 87.44 feet, above the city datum line; thence along the east side of Alvasia street 50.00 feet to an elevation of 88.64 feet above said datum line. Thence, along the East line of Alvasia street 50.00 feet to an elevation of 89.99 feet above said datum line. Thence along said line 50.00 feet to an elevation of 91.92 feet above said datum line; Thence along said line 50.00 feet to an elevation of 93.56 feet above said datum line; thence along said line 50.00 feet to an elevation of 95.60 feet above said datum line; thence with said line 50.00 feet to an elevation of 97.86 feet above said datum line. Thence with said line 50.00 feet to an elevation of 99.46 feet above said datum line. Thence along said line 50.00 feet to an elevation of 100.67 feet above said datum line; thence along said line 20.00 feet to an elevation of 100.87 feet above said datum line.

Section 3. There shall be laid on the east side of Alvasia Street between Clay and Dixon streets at the place above mentioned a five (5) foot concrete sidewalk, which said sidewalk shall be laid contiguous to and adjacent to the east property line of said Alvasia Street, and contiguous to and adjacent to said sidewalk there shall be constructed a twenty-four (24) inch combined curb and gutter. The entire width of the sidewalk from the east property line of Alvasia Street to the travelled portion of Alvasia Street shall be graded, also the approaches to said street where alleys or driveways cross from or intersect with the travelled portion of said Alvasia Street.

Section 4 Excavating and Grading. Existing material within the roadway of this improvement, as defined by that space where said improvement is to be made, shall be excavated and graded and prepared for use as a sub-grade under the five foot sidewalks, and as gutters and roadways on the other part of the said street.

The excavation shall be done in such manner that the finished sub-grade under the sidewalk and the gutters and roadways shall conform to the grade and the contour of the finished sidewalk, gutter, and roadway.

Disposal of Excavated Material. All material excavated from this improvement, unless especially required elsewhere within said property lines of the street or pavement, shall be the property of the contractor and shall be disposed of by the contractor and removed from the street.

Fills. Where the present surface of the roadway, etc., is below the grade, it shall be filled in with selected material from the excavation and placed so as to conform to the line, grade and contour of said street.

Protection of Underground Work and Adjustment of Existing Structures. The contractor shall exercise every precaution to avoid disturbing or injuring sewers, service pipes, catch basins, inlets, valves, valve boxes, gas mains, water mains, etc.

The said improvement shall be laid and constructed so as to conform as nearly as practicable to the above grades.

Section 5. Said sidewalks shall be laid and constructed of concrete five (5) feet in width in all respects of the kind, quality and dimensions, and of the materials mentioned and described in Section 3, Specifications No. 2, and sub-sections thereunder of an Ordinance entitled, "an Ordinance Providing for the Kind and Character of Sidewalks, Curbing and Guttering to be hereinafter used in the City of Henderson, Kentucky, and prescribing specifications for same", Passed on its second reading by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Henderson, Kentucky, on 30th day of September, 1922, and recorded in the office of the City Clerk of said City, in Ordinance Book No. 5, at page 168. There shall be left for a grass plot or grass plots, all the space between the property line and outer edge of sidewalk, curb and gutter not occupied by the sidewalk, curb and gutter.

Section 6. Sections Nos. 1, 7, 8 and 9 of the aforesaid ordinances are also herein referred to and made parts of this ordinance.

Section 7. That the entire cost and expense of the aforesaid sidewalk, curb and gutter, including the work and the furnishing of the materials as provided for in this ordinance, shall be paid by the owners of

ber of abutting feet owned by them respectively. Provided that when the cost of said improvement assessed against any lot or parcel of real estate, or owner thereof, exceeds one-half of the value of such lot or parcel of real estate, such excess shall be paid out of the general fund of the City of Henderson, but the improvement shall be taken into consideration in fixing the value of such real estate.

Section 8. That the improvement provided for in this ordinance shall be made on the ten year plan, and paid for in ten annual instalments, as provided for by Section 3458, of the Kentucky Statutes, which is an Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, entitled:

"AN ACT to amend and re-enact sections three thousand four hundred and forty-nine, three thousand four hundred and fifty, three thousand four hundred and fifty-one, three thousand four hundred and fifty-two, three thousand four hundred and fifty-three, three thousand four hundred and fifty-four, three thousand four hundred and fifty-five, three thousand four hundred and fifty-six, three thousand four hundred and fifty-seven, three thousand four hundred and fifty-eight, three thousand four hundred and fifty-nine of the Kentucky Statutes relating to the control and improvement of public streets, alleys, sidewalks, roads, lanes, avenues, highways, and thoroughfares in cities of the third class," which was approved by the Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky on March 7 1924, and which is Chapter 10 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Kentucky of 1916, and further as amended by the acts of the Kentucky legislature in 1922 and known as Chapter 129 of the Acts of 1922.

The work provided for herein shall be done by contract, let by said city upon competitive bidding to the lowest and best bidder, after advertisement for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Henderson, Kentucky, the said city reserving the right to reject any and all bids, and each bidder shall be required to accompany his bid with a cash deposit of \$100.00 with the City Clerk of said City or by a certified check for that amount payable to the said City as a guaranty of his good faith to insure compliance with his bid, and which amount shall be forfeited to said City in the event of his bid is accepted and he shall fail to comply with his bid and enter into a satisfactory contract and bond for the construction of said work and the furnishing of said material. The bond for said work is fixed at a sum equal to one-half the estimated contract price, and the contract made hereunder shall stipulate a guarantee by the contractor of said work for five years from its acceptance by the Board of Commissioners.

Section 9. All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 10. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force ten days from and after its second and final passage. Passed on its first reading 29th day of September, 1924.

Section 1. That no gasoline or oil filling service stations, or pumps or tanks or other accessories or apparatus used in the sale of gasoline and oil for motor vehicles shall be erected or installed within the City of Henderson, Kentucky, without a permit for the erection or installation of such station having first been granted by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Henderson, Kentucky.

Section 2. Application for permits to erect such stations referred to in Section 1. hereof shall be made in writing to the said Board of Commissioners by the owner, lessee, or manager of any such proposed filling service station, and shall only be erected and maintained at the place or places designated by the Board of Commissioners.

Section 3. The Board of Commissioners of the City of Henderson shall have the power to determine what places or locations are suitable for erection and maintenance of such filling service stations as referred to in Section 1. hereof, and shall have the right and power to decline to issue a permit for the erection or maintenance of such stations at all places and locations deemed to be unsuitable, by said Board of Commissioners, for such service stations.

Section 4. No permit shall ever be issued to erect such stations as referred to in Section 1. hereof at any place or location which is within five hundred feet of any property used in whole or in part for school purposes.

Section 5. Should any person or persons, corporation or company, whether owner, lessee, or occupant erect, install or cause to be erected or installed, maintain or caused to be maintained, any filling service station as referred to by Section 1. hereof, without a permit therefor as provided for in this ordinance, or at a place or location prohibited by Section 4. hereof, the person or persons, or corporation or company so offending shall be fined not less than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) nor exceeding Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), for each day this said ordinance is violated, and each day shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed.
